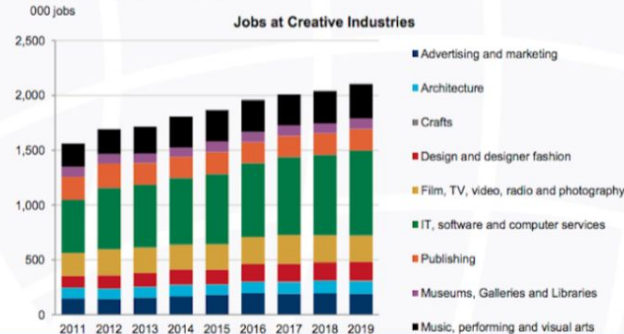

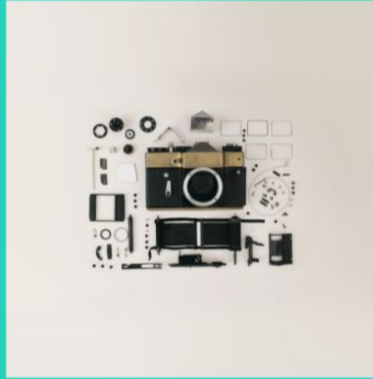


Creative industries' employment accounted for 6.3% of UK jobs in 2019

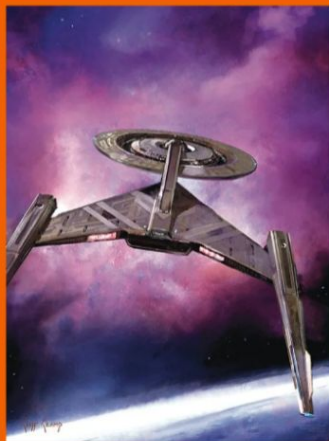

# Coursework 60% of GCSE

## Unit one YEAR 10

Scholar led ideas, linked to their interests and passions. Discover how mediums react to their ideas and investigate how others explored these themes. Record ideas through PhotoShop and photography, all within a portfolio, culminating in a final outcome.

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## Unit two Year 11 Easter of Year 10 to December of Year 11

Scholars may continue their Year 10 theme but develop it further or explore a new idea. They will follow the same process as in Year 10 but demonstrate a greater skill set due to their development through Year 10

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## Externally set EXAM 40% of GCSE January to March Year 11

Theme set by exam board (EDEXCEL). Scholars will create a portfolio linked to the theme and present a final outcome under exam conditions.

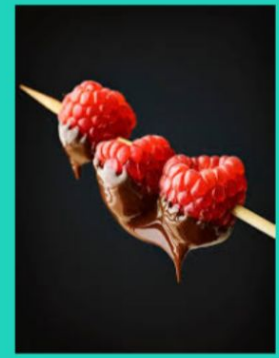
