

IMPORTANT EXAM INFORMATION 2025-26

- Arrive in plenty of time for all your exams (at least ten minutes before the start of each exam).
 Check your timetable carefully so that you know the correct dates and times of every exam.
- You MUST NOT take any unauthorised items into the exam room:
 Airpods, Earphones/Earbuds, an iPod, a mobile phone, an MP3/4 player or similar device, a watch, smart glasses or any other smart device. Possession of unauthorised material is

breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.

- You must bring a black ball point pen (biro) with you to every exam. Do not use correcting
 pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers. Highlighters can
 only be used to highlight sections of the question paper and/or extract(s). You are responsible
 for producing legible writing.
- You will be provided with exams equipment for the papers that specify this, however, should you wish to bring your own equipment it must be in a see-through pencil case. Calculator cases are not allowed in the exam room. All equipment belonging to the exams department must be left on your exam desk. Any damage to exams equipment will result in a letter home to your parent(s)/carer(s) with a fine for the cost of replacement equipment. Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the exam.
- If you wish to bring a drink into the exam room, you are only allowed to bring one small bottle of water in a **transparent** plastic bottle **free of labels**.
- Listen carefully to the invigilator's instructions and do not start writing anything until the
 invigilator tells you to fill in the required details on the front of the paper. Make sure you remain
 under exam conditions from the moment you enter the exam room until the moment you leave
 the exam room and surrounding area.
- You must write your legal first name and last name on the front of the examination paper.
 Awarding bodies will not accept 'preferred' names.
- Candidate cards must be left on your exam desk at the end of every exam. Any defacing/ damage to candidate cards will result in a fine of £1 per card.
- If you finish an exam early, please read through your answers. Candidates are not allowed to leave the exam room early. You must remain in the exam room for the full duration.
- Please check seating plans daily on the Exams noticeboards in the Languages corridor, to make sure you go to the correct exam room. The exam room you are seated in may vary according to the exam taking place.

- Unacceptable behaviour during exams will not be tolerated and you will be removed from the
 exam room risking disqualification from the exam. Your parent(s)/carer(s) will be contacted
 and the exam board must be notified.
- Should you have a query in the exam room please inform the invigilator immediately. Please
 note that if you have any issues these must be reported to the invigilator while you are in the
 exam room. It is too late to report an issue after the exam has finished and the exam room
 has been dismissed.
